⁶ "Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

⁷ Placement Rates are calculated by dividing the number of graduates employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment for a program that is: designed, or advertised, to lead to a particular career; or advertised or promoted with any claim regarding job placement.

⁸ Number of Graduates means the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year and were eligible to take the licensing exam the first time that the exam was available after completion of the program.

⁹ Exam Date means the date for the first available exam after the graduates completed the program.

¹⁰ Passage Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who pass the exam by the number of graduates who take the licensing exam the first time that the exam is available after completion of the program.

¹¹ Graduates available for employment means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
